



Behind every good school may be found an efficient controlling body of sincere workers, and Dundee's administration is no exception, as the high standard of smooth operation shows.






Christmas Dance



At the dance, Jackie Christensen and her date won the prize for the best costumed couple, coming as clowns. A French waitress named Linda Silva won the best single costume prize.





My dearest memories of the school are such treasures that you may be sure that they will be forever with me, to be shared with all those with whom I converse—the first snow which I saw from the typing class window; the gift of a "mum" and Homecoming glory; the thrill of having Shakespeare's words "When icicles hang by the wall . . . become real, and so very beautiful; the mornings in homeroom with firm voices pledging allegiance; the sweetness of Miss Keeler's welcome, and then your dear warm endorsement of it; the flower from Frostie's crew; and the mangled cat I helped to dissect in Biology, to mention just a tiny few of them.

I'm sure Susie will verify that it falls strangely on one's ears to be called "a foreigner" but a few days journey from home. It is stranger still to realize that one's habits and speech are different and alien. However, I found that it was really "bonzer" to be such a person—who called sweaters, jumpers, and french fries, potato chips; who hadn't eaten hamburgers or corn-on-the-cob; who hadn't seen Chicago or a class ring or a gridiron football game; who talked about the "boot" of a car instead of the hood, and thought of Congress as a Parliament. There was always someone to help me, to laugh with me,

to offer to take me to Chicago, or a library, or ice-skating, or to just talk.

As I look back now with a thousand new friends and a new family, and with the year's experience behind me, I can smile at my wonder at the "huge" school into which came at first, fresh from Horsham High's six hundred seventh to twelfth graders. The differences were so apparent at first—the lack of uniform clothing for school, the magnificent gymnasium, and the cheerleading. Soon, though, I was able to find more and more similarities—fun-loving and hard-working students, devoted and kind teachers, and interested parents.

That the brotherhood of nations transcends the sovereignity of nations is the wonderful truth that I have seen verified countless times over. Americans have a fine, intensely nationalistic trait that I admire and respect just as you have understood my pride in Australia. And, hand in hand with this, we have a common patriotism to the world spirit


which unites us across ten thousand miles. . . . Lorraine.

The American Field Service Program helps to create world unity through understanding of other people. All human beings are the same the world over, in spite of the superficial differences in customs. traditions, and languages.

I, the second Dundee representative of the Americans Abroad. section of the American Field Service, indeed conclude that it is truly a wonderful experience for young persons to live with a foreign

family in order to forge the Bond of Brotherhood.

My sincerest thanks I extend to all Dundee for their help which gave me the opportunity to start a path of hope and cheer, which shall bridge the walls of envy, doubt, and fear. . . . Susi.



The 1961 Prom






Cardunals End Great Season
