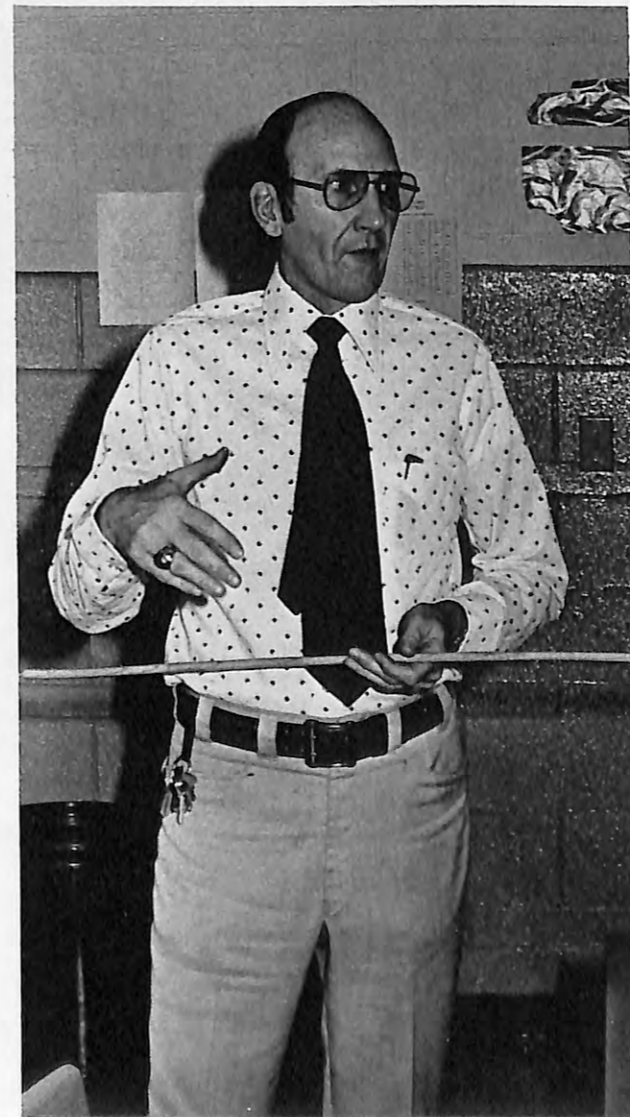
DRIVER EDUCATION

The Dundee FOCUS newspaper, under the capable leadership of its Managing Editor, Steve Rose and advertising control of Lynette Billings, again ranked in the top 25% of the high school news publications in the nation. The survey and critique provided by the National Scholastic Press Association determined that "the FOCUS newspaper...had an excellent base on which to build." "There are too many people to list, but the job done by each staff member was critical to the publication. 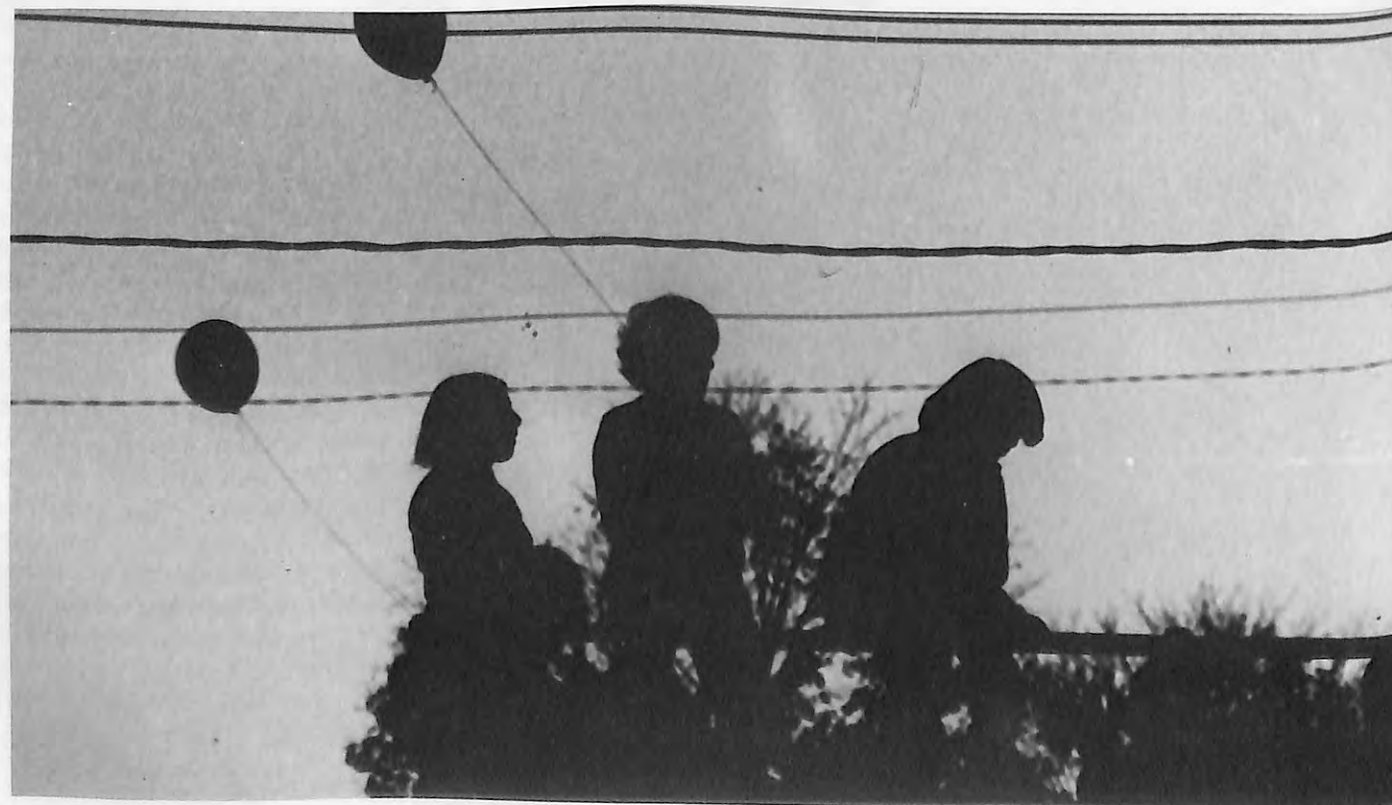

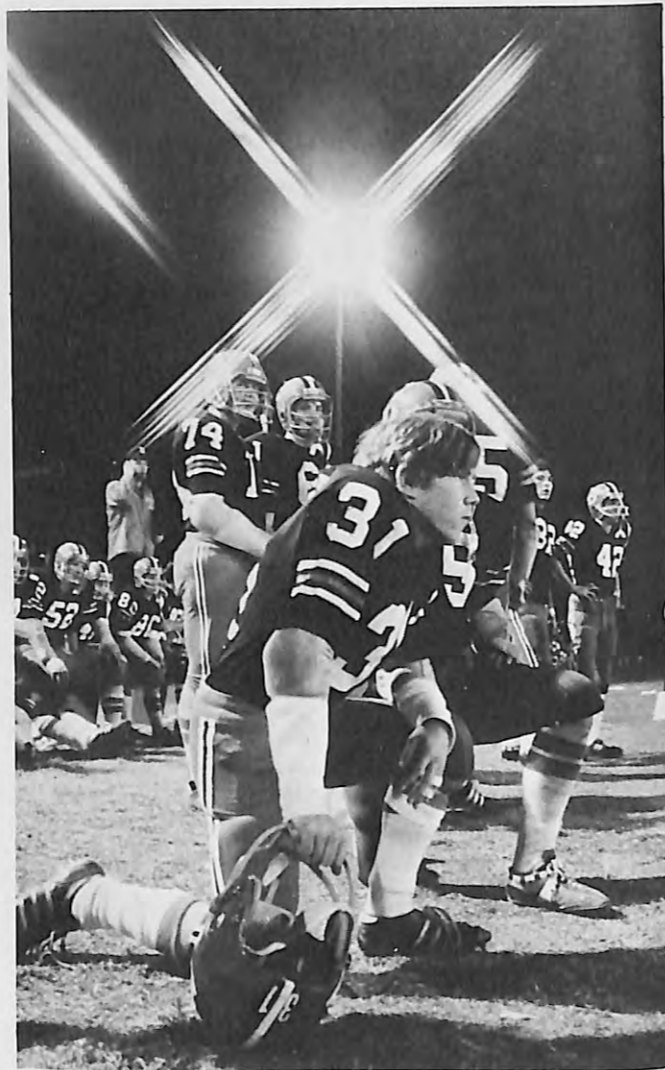

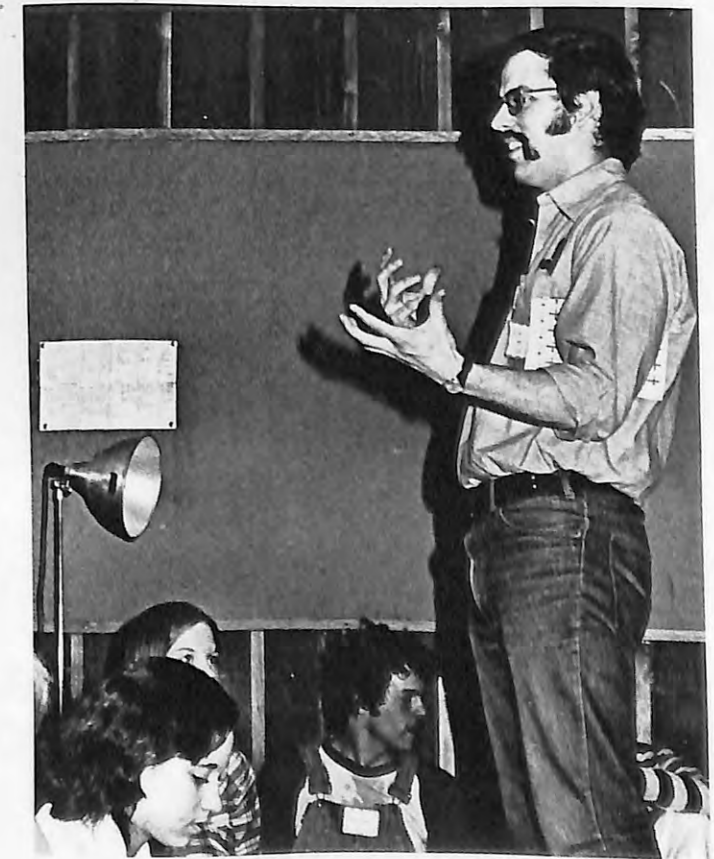

YOUNG LIFE

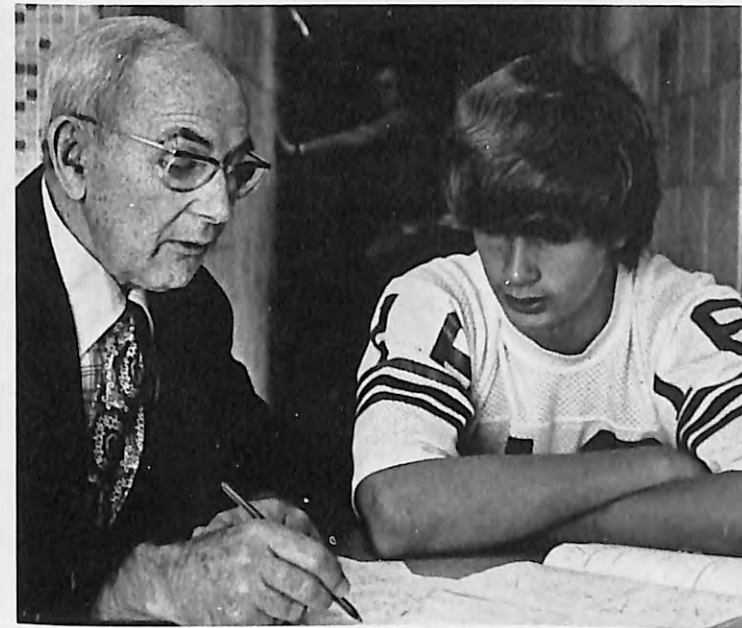

Fitz Goes State

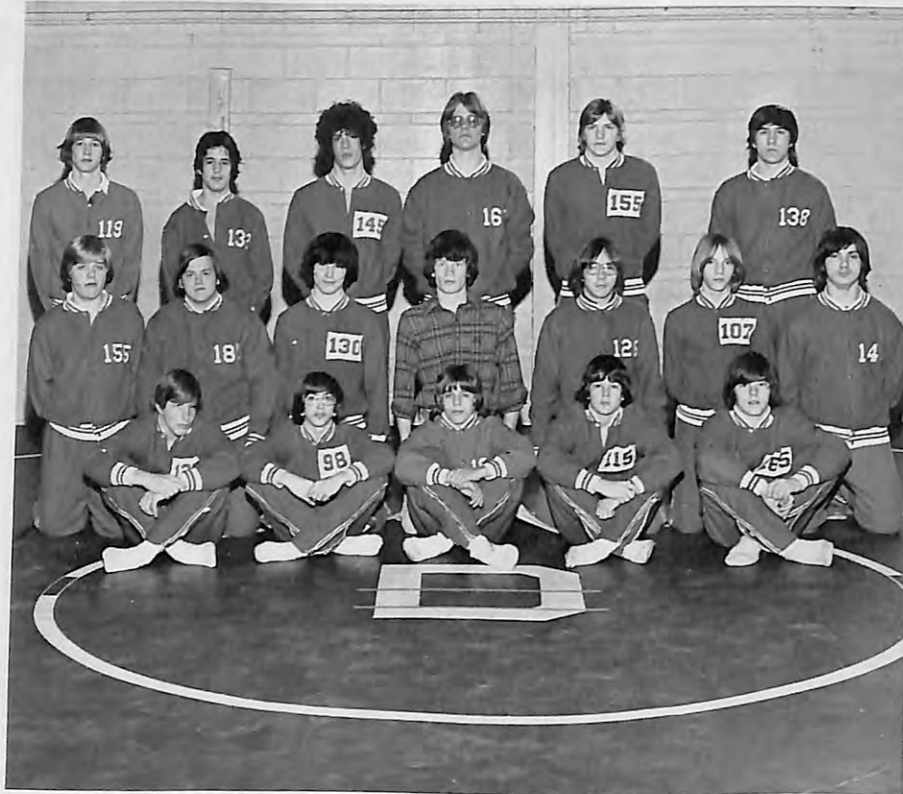
