

















THE 1976 SENIOR CLASS



THE 1976 JUNIOR CLASS



THE 1976 SOPHOMORE CLASS


















THE 1976 FRESHMAN CLASS

The survey and critique provided by the National Scholastic Press Association determined that "the FOCUS newspaper...had an excellent base on which to build." "There are too many people to list, but the job done by each staff member was critical to the publication. Everyone contributed to what must be considered one of the best newspapers this school has published in years," said Mr. Glenn Meade, FOCUS adviser. Although modest success has been earned by the FOCUS, the organization itself has been hampered by the lack of continuity. "The main problem has been getting the capable staff members to enroll in a similar course. The students showing genuine interest in continuing with journalism have been neglected. They can't receive credit for taking the course again, and the attempts toward offering Journalism 4,5 and 6 have been rejected," said Mr. Meade. Hopefully, the FOCUS will be able to contribute even more to the school in the future.


