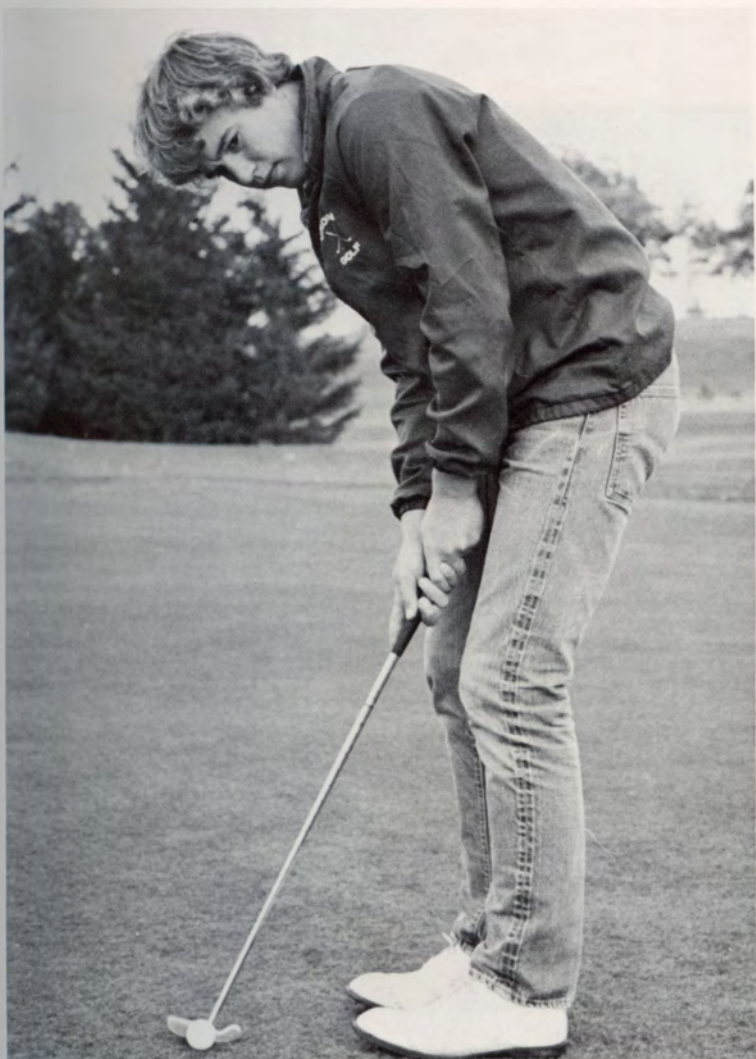

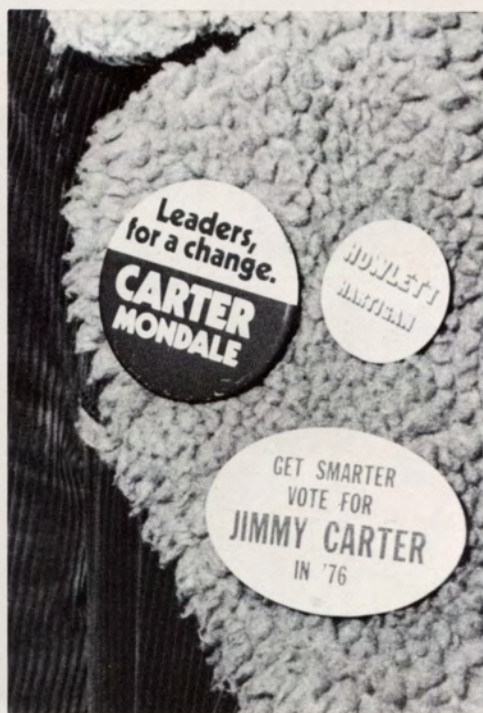

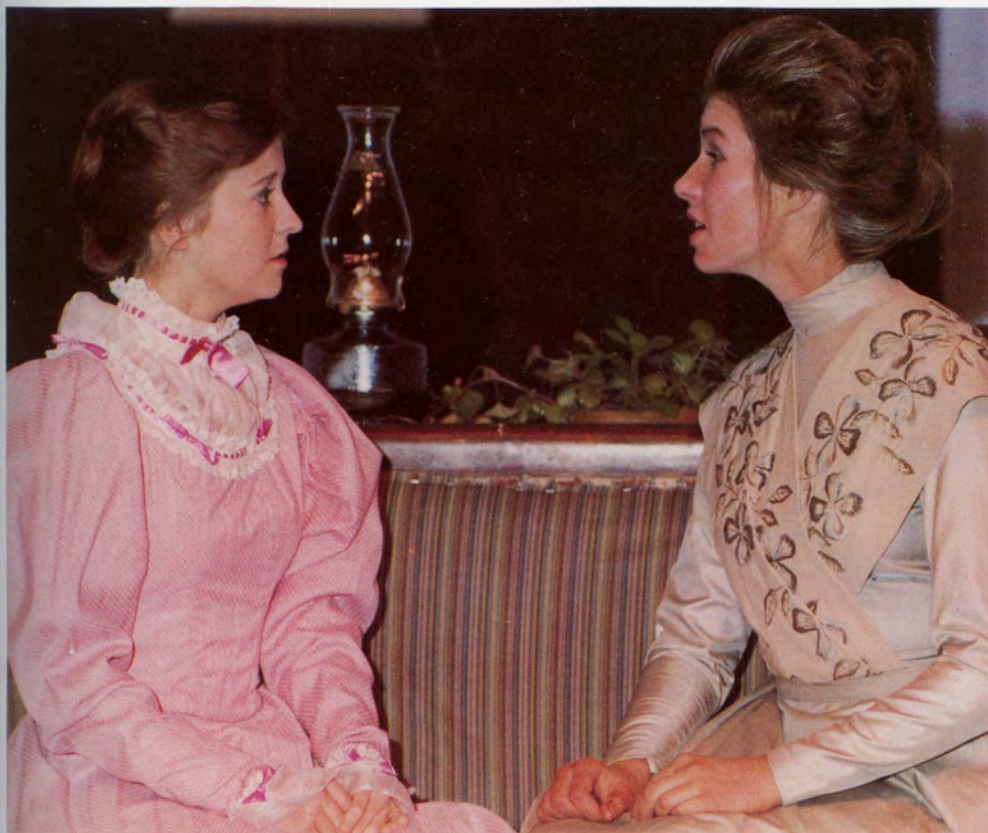

Crown Players stroll

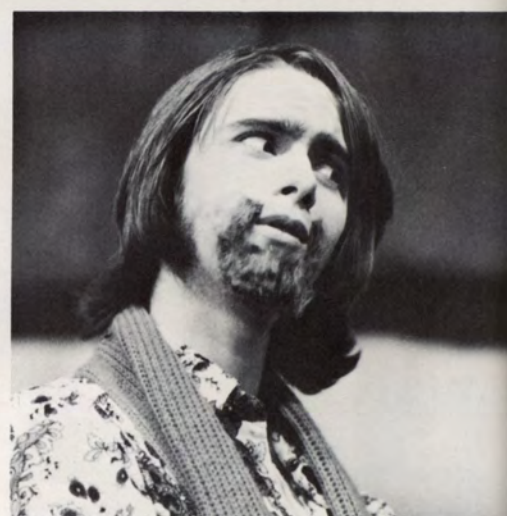

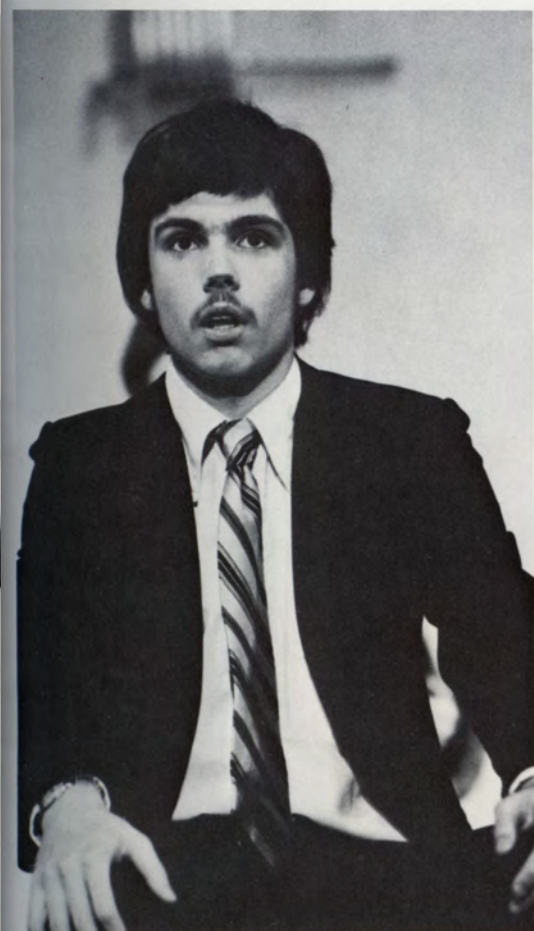

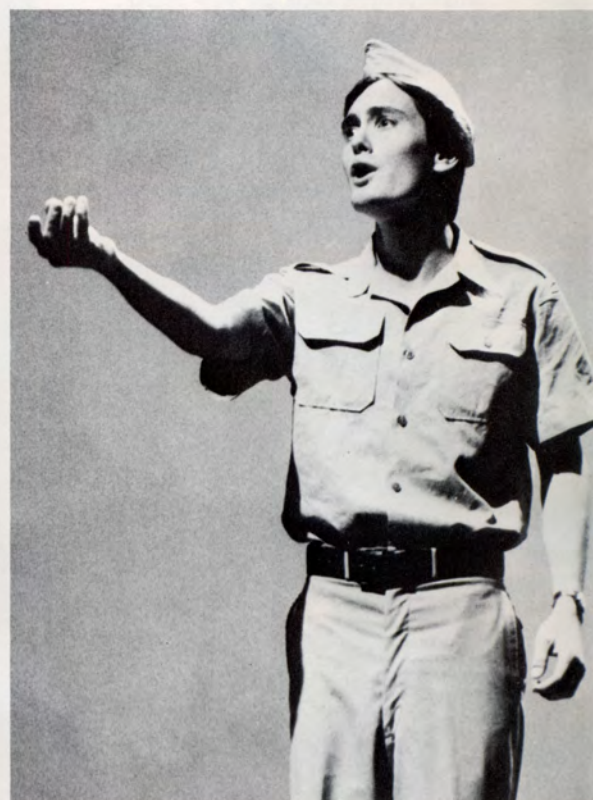
"Happy Talk"

On May 6, 7, 13, and 14 the ICP presented the Rodgers and Hammerstein classic, *SOUTH PACIFIC*. The play is actually three stories set on a South Pacific Island during WWII. The most famous of these stories concerns the romance between the mysterious French planter, Emile de Becque (Pat Smolen) and the outgoing country girl, Nellie Forbush (Cindy Schneeegas-Friday, Laurel Bleckfeld-Saturday). Perhaps the most moving story involves the romance between the American Lt. Joseph Cable (Tim Miller) and the daughter of Bloody Mary (Carol Hardtke), Liat (Flora Liare). Cable falls deeply in love with Liat but can not bring himself to marry her because she is Polynesian. Likewise, Nellie cannot marry Emile because he at one time had a Polynesian wife and two children by her.

The two love stories are intertwined around Capt. Brackett's (Mike Danahey) Operation Alligator, a plan designed to "turn the tide of war" in the South Pacific. Because of their difficulties with love, both Cable and de Beque rashly volunteer their services to the mission and are hidden on a Japanese held island to spy. Unfortunately, only de Becque survives, but the mission is termed a success and Emile and Nellie reunite and live happily ever after.

The play, however, is not only a love story but also contains many hilarious comedic scenes. The basic plot involved the exploits of the wheeler-dealer, Luther Billis (Dave Christensen-Friday, Sam Hranac-Saturday), his island supplier, Bloody Mary, and the things they do to make life fun for the soldiers and miserable for the stern island commander Capt. "Iron Belly" Brackett.

"Get the picture"

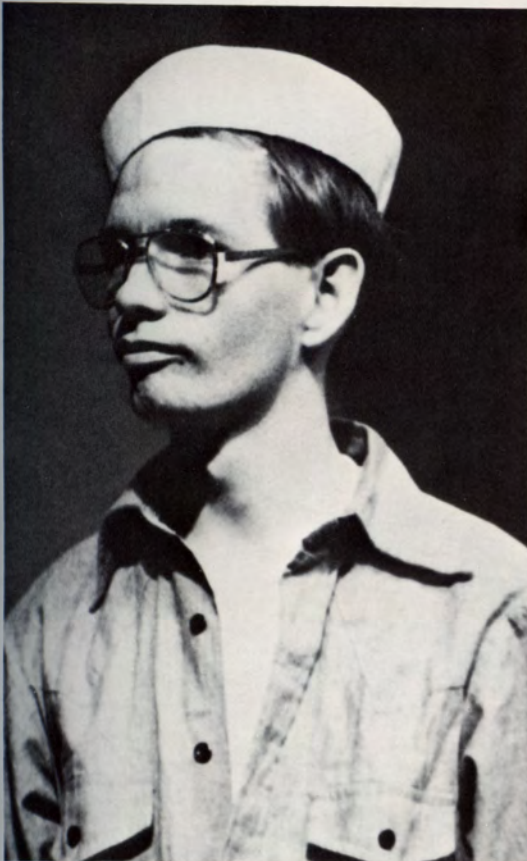

On television, Fonzie and the HAPPY DAYS crew enjoyed another successful year, but a new ABC show captured the hearts, if not the minds, of America's males, CHARLIE'S ANGELS, featuring Farah Fawcett-Majors and her faddish hairdo. The most critically acclaimed show and the most widely viewed was ROOTS, the tale of one man's family traced from the time his ancestor Kunta Kinte was brought from Africa to America. The book of the same name, by Alex Haley, won a Pulitzer Prize for literature.

At the cinema, the most popular movie of the year was ROCKY, the Academy Award winning Cinderella tale concerning a third-rate boxer who gets his dream chance to go the distance with the champ. The star of the film, Sylvester Stallone, also wrote the script. Critics are hailing him as the new Brando and he has returned an air of optimism into the film industry. Other popular films of the year included NETWORK, a satire about television, CARRIÉ, the tale of a telekinetic girl, and the excessive remake of KING KONG.

On the turntables, the hottest new act appeared to be Boston, a group claiming to provide better music through science. In the late spring, another new act called Foreigner was emerging on the scene. Disco music also remained in the main stream with the popular disco version of Beethoven's Fifth Symphony and the outrageous "Disco Duck," both topping the charts. Other musical highlights of the year included Stevie Wonder's "Songs in the Key of Life," "Peter Frampton Comes Alive," and Steve Miller's "Fly Like an Eagle."

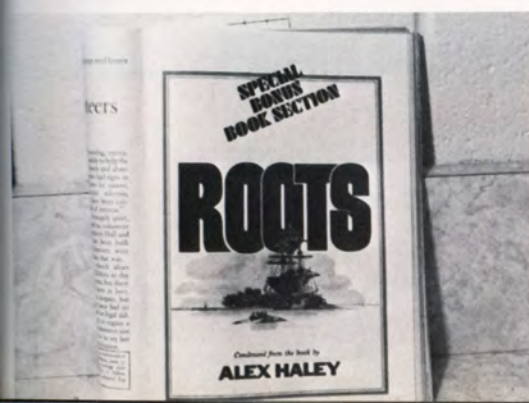

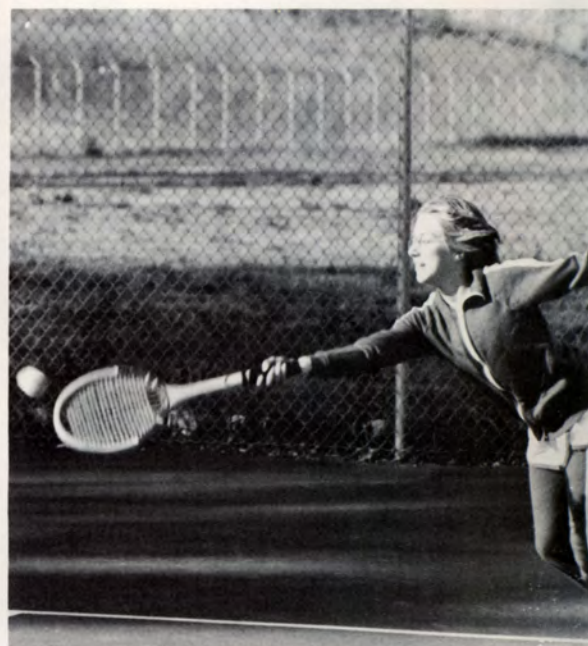

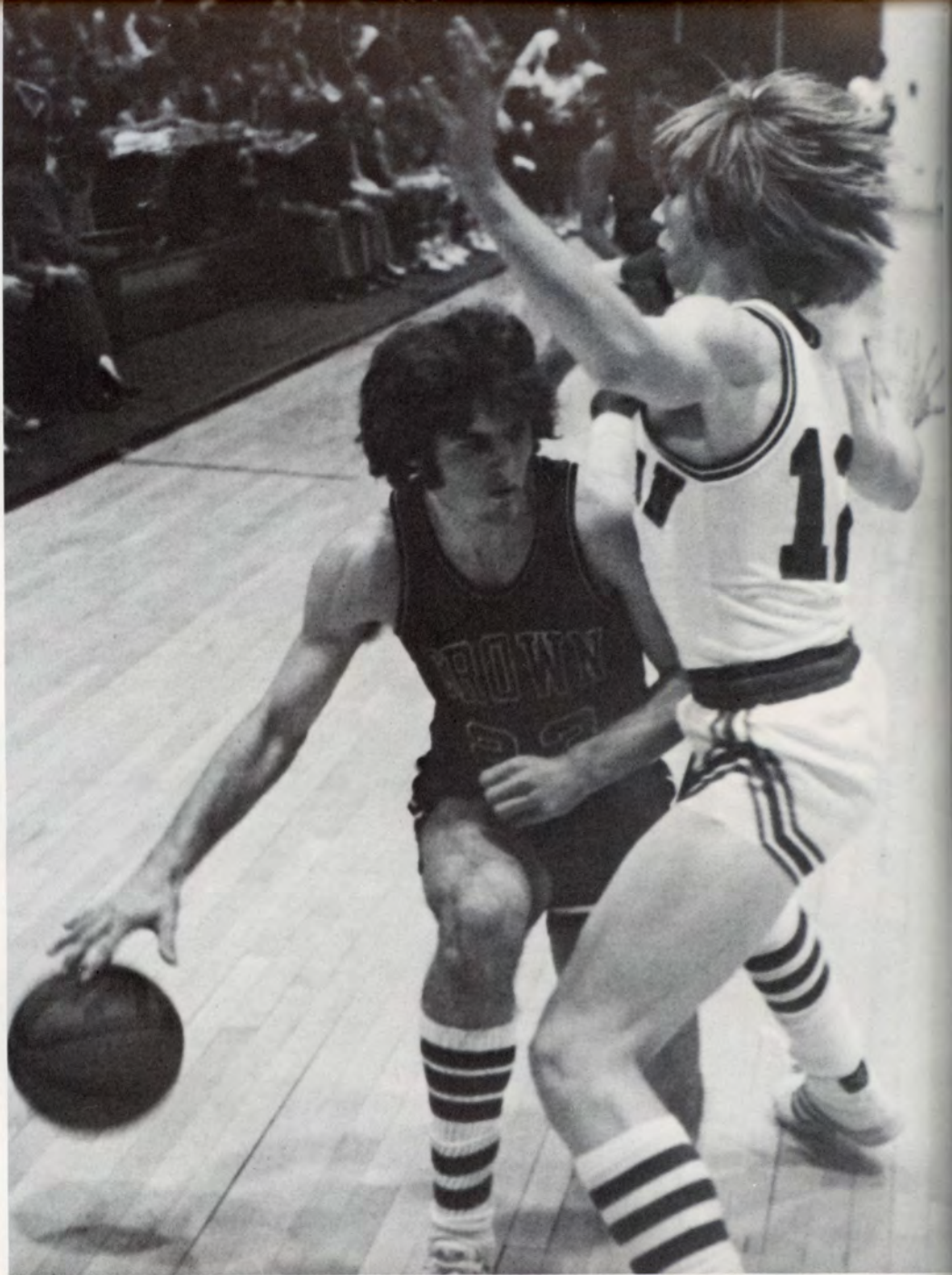

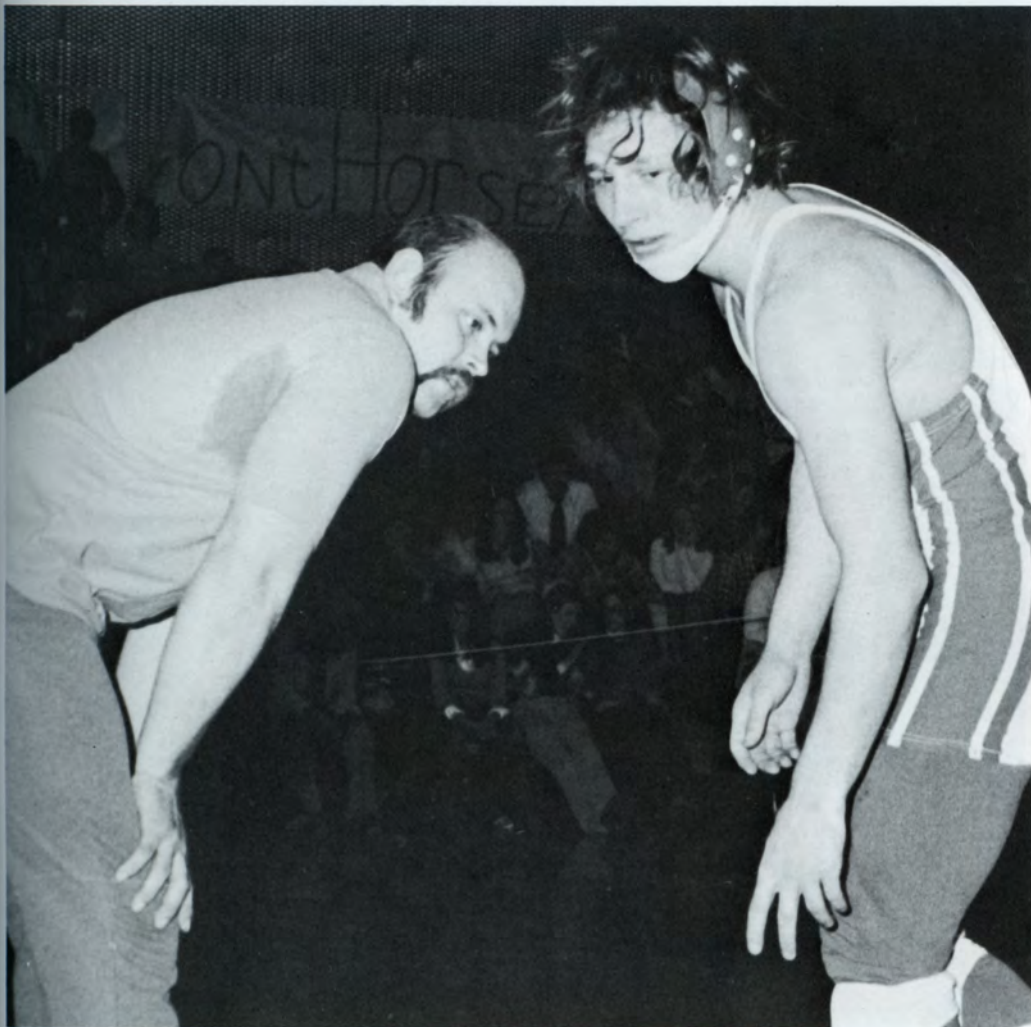

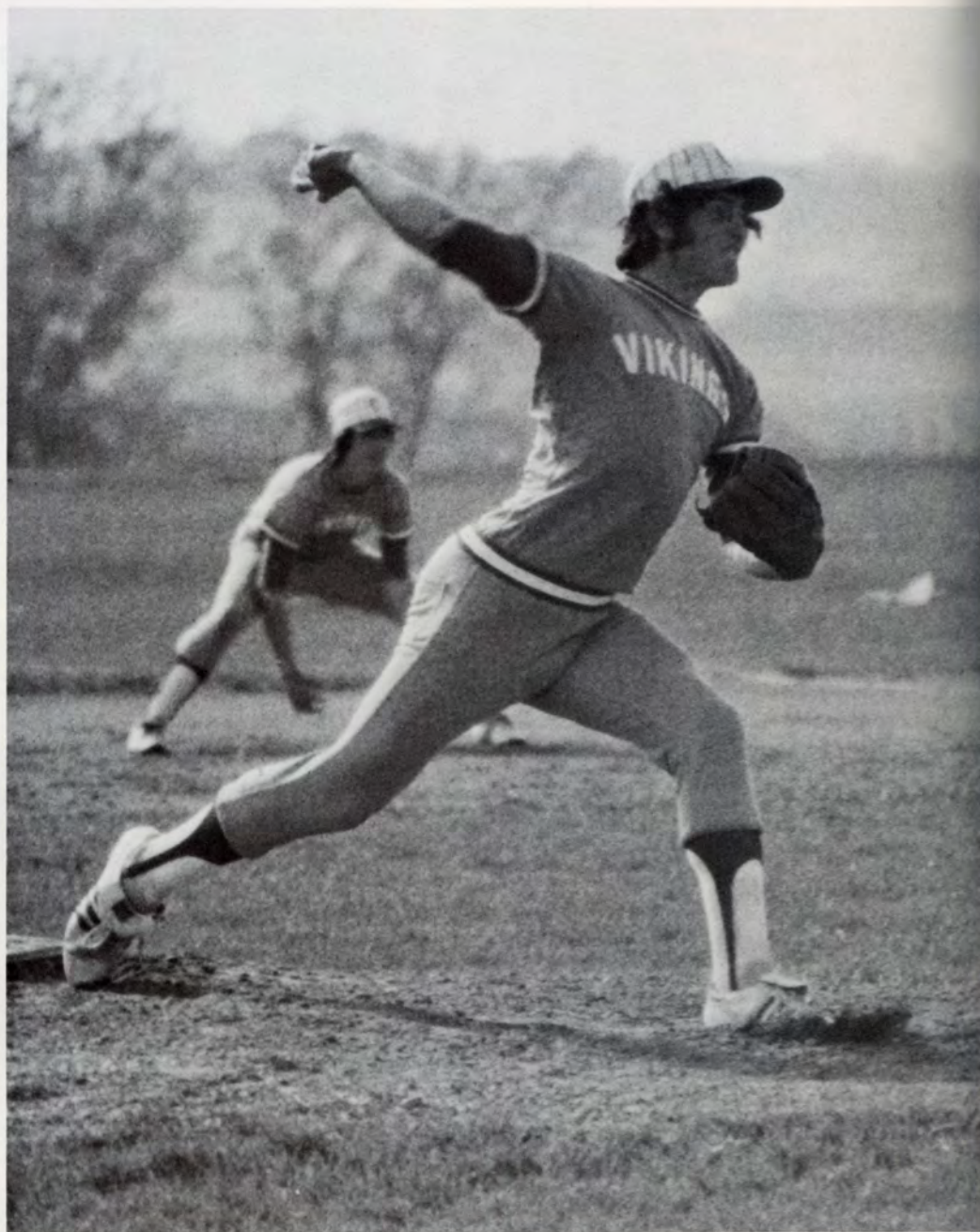

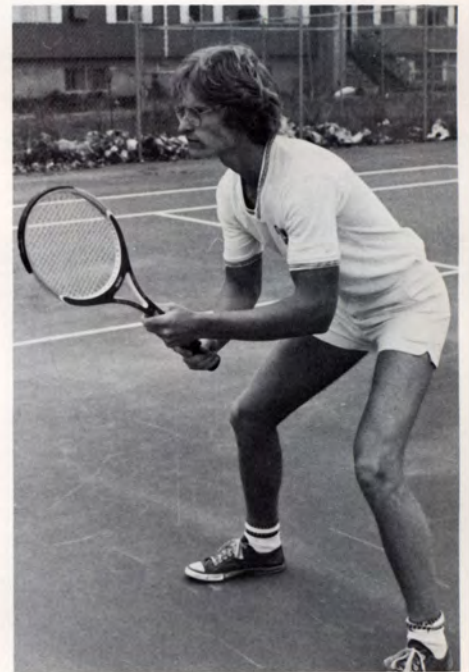

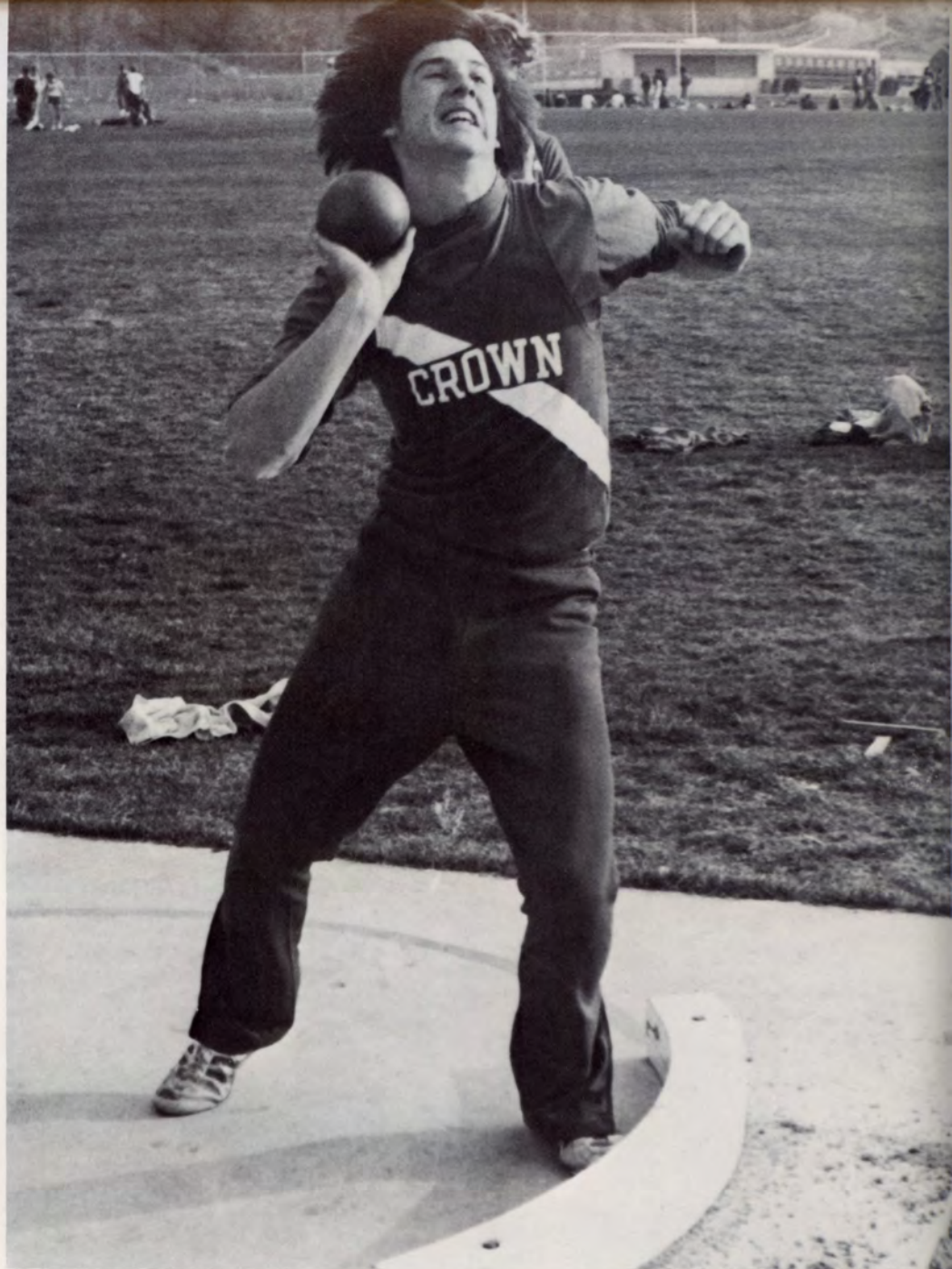

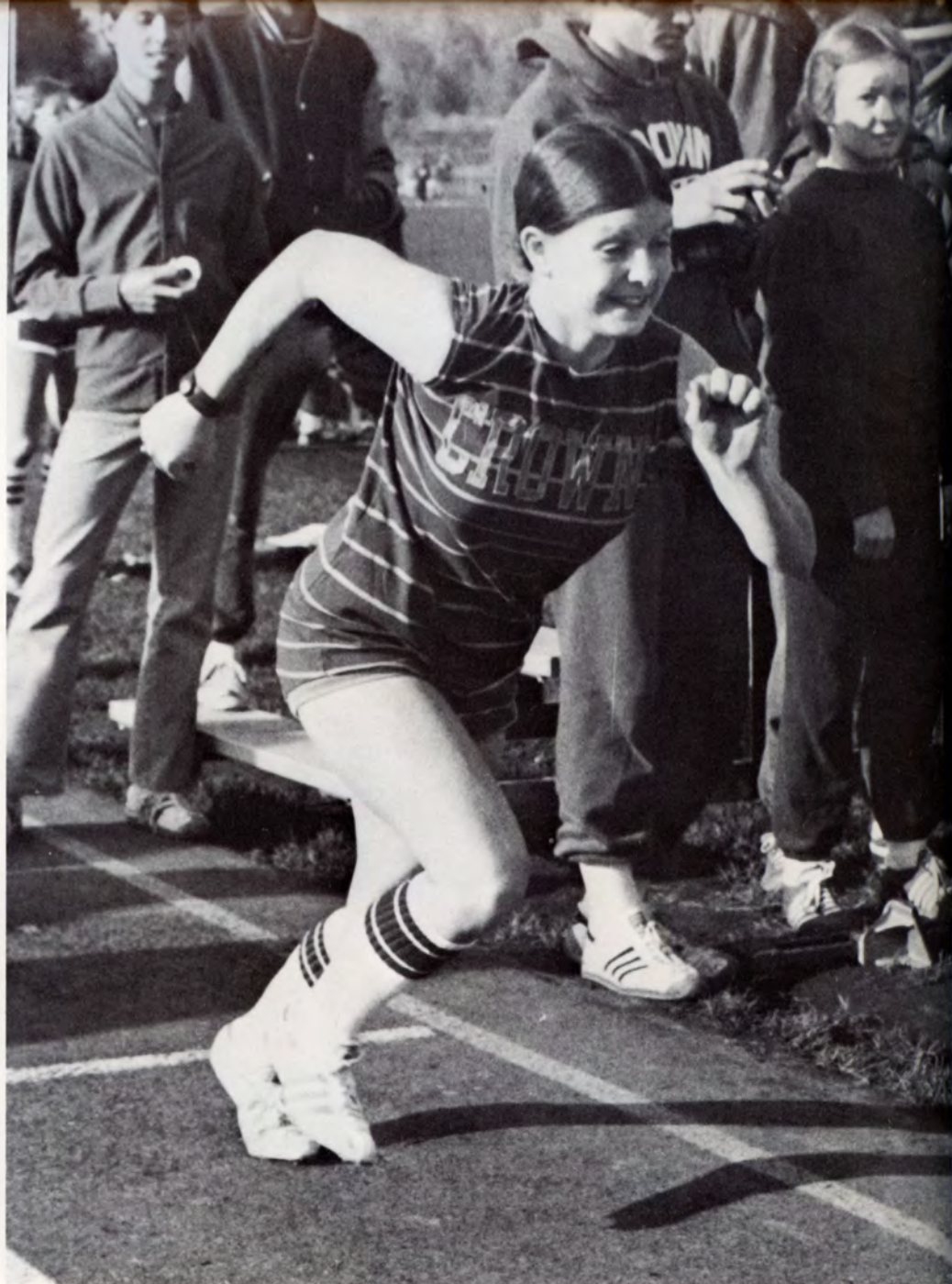
